

## Blueprint for Learning

Every child deserves to be educated. Jurupa Unified School District's Blueprint for Learning is our plan to focus on student achievement and assure that no child is denied the promise of a quality education. This is Jurupa Unified School District's Five Point Plan:

**(1) The Resources:** Focus fiscal resources, including categorical monies, on providing tools to sites, including staff development, assessment, support and materials, and human resources. Utilize an evaluation system with administrators to clarify expectations, focusing on the implementation of the plan. Provide training and support to teachers and principals.

**(2) The Structure:** Continue to focus on alignment of standards (what students are expected to know), content (what is taught), and assessment (what is learned) in an integrated instructional system.

**(3) The Materials:** Access to the core curriculum is supported through standards-based textbooks, instructional technology, reading and math interventions, English Language Development, and adopted supplemental materials.

**(4) The Method:** Various strategies are used to ensure that all students have an opportunity for success:

- Utilizing assessment data to focus on individual student achievement.
- Providing opportunities for teachers to share and critique instructional strategies.
- Providing interventions for students who are scoring Below Basic, Far Below Basic and who have not passed the High School Exit Exam.
- Exploring and implementing innovative and research-based programs to improve student achievement.

**(5) The Support:** A structure is provided to support students and teachers:

- Adequate support systems for students at risk.
- Extra-curricular activities that both enhance instruction and provide opportunities for social and athletic development, as well as engaging students.
- Improvement of attendance, keeping students in school, graduation and post-secondary opportunities.
- Training and coaching to support excellent teaching and learning.
- Ample opportunities for teacher collaboration and professional growth.

Mastery of grade level standards is our goal for each student. As educators, we strive to teach every student so that he or she acquires grade level skills and knowledge.
